<b>Alternatives to Addiction:</b> A unique, community-wide program designed specifically as a culturally relevant response to the disease of addiction within the Jewish community. Includes outreach and education, support for those in recovery, clinical services within a Jewish context and advocacy.	213	869 service hours
<b>Counseling Services:</b> Individual, couple, family and group counseling provided by professional therapists utilizing a variety of therapeutic modalities.	375	2,667 service hours
<b>Emergency Services (ES) &amp; Food Bank (FB):</b> A network of services for those in crisis and financial distress. <b>Family Life Education &amp; Endless Opportunities:</b> A wide variety of culturally relevant educational workshops and groups that cover the lifespan of changes and challenges — all intended to strengthen individuals and families. <i>Endless Opportunities</i> facilitates meaningful connections to community for active, healthy adults age 60+.	1,711	4,194 service hours
<b>HomeCare Associates:</b> The state licensed home care division of JFS. Responds to the evolving needs of our loved ones and peace-of-mind requirements of families by providing personal care, homemaker and companion services that allow older adults to live independently for as long as possible.	487	80,138 service hours
<b>Project DVORA: Domestic Violence Outreach, Response &amp; Advocacy</b> provides advocacy-based counseling and support to domestic violence victims and their families, specialized classes for children and educational trainings for professionals and community members.	568	1,545 service hours
<b>Refugee &amp; Immigrant Service Centers:</b> Services for refugees and immigrants from all cultures world-wide who are resettling in the Puget Sound area. Includes financial assistance, case management, employment services, vocational assistance and English as a Second Language (ESL) classes.	1,609	44,477 service hours
<b>SAJD: Seattle Association for Jews with Disabilities</b> provides skilled, compassionate, supported living services for people with developmental disabilities, persistent mental illness and brain injuries — assisting clients of all backgrounds realize their highest potential while living richer, more satisfying lives.	372	7,966 service hours
<b>Volunteer Services:</b> Volunteers serve seniors, work in the <i>Food Bank</i> , deliver groceries to homebound individuals, teach English as a Second Language to resettled refugees, mentor Jewish children, enrich the lives of people challenged by cognitive disabilities and support the Agency through committee work, clerical assistance and more.	1,575	15,115 volunteer hours
