Free Services for Holocaust Survivors

Jewish Family Service offers social services to eligible Holocaust survivors at no cost, supported by a grant from the Conference on Jewish Material Claims Against Germany.

Who is considered a Holocaust survivor?

Survivors are any Jewish individuals who lived for any amount of time under Nazi domination, whether or not they spent time in a concentration camp.

Who is eligible to receive services?

All survivors may apply to determine if they are eligible. It is not necessary to have a low income to qualify although assets and income are taken into consideration in the application process.

What services are provided?

- Care Management
- In-Home Care
- Emergency Financial Assistance
- Dental Services
- Legal Services
- Russian Language Socialization Programming
